Infections of the urinary tract, respiratory tract, and skin and soft-tissues are the most common infectious conditions affecting patients across diverse healthcare settings. Unfortunately, inappropriate antibiotic prescribing for these infections is common and can result in sub-optimal patient outcomes, the development of antimicrobial resistance, and serious adverse reactions such as *Clostridioides difficile* infection. This educational event is designed to apply the principles of antimicrobial stewardship to the management of these common infections with a goal of improved antimicrobial use and patient outcomes. Strategies to support implementing these best practices will also be discussed.

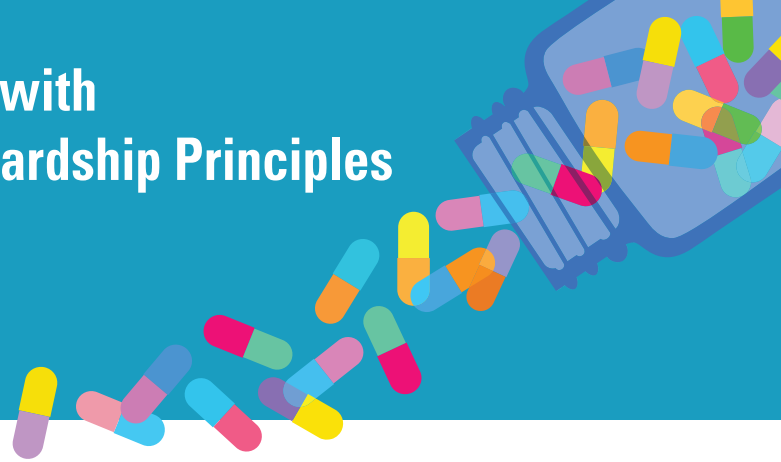
